ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

For forty-one years now, Orlando Galleries and CSUN have been active in the San Fernando Valley art scene. Both were established in 1958. CSUN was then San Fernando Valley State College, and from the beginning, the Art Department sponsored exhibitions of works by students, faculty and regional artists. With Orlando as the primary commercial gallery for contemporary art in the Valley, and the CSUN campus having the primary non-profit gallery in the Valley, the interest and programs of both frequently paralleled each other, particularly in the sponsorship of exhibitions by regional artists. Many faculty and alumni artists from CSUN gravitated to Orlando for off-campus shows.

Over the years, the focus and variety of artists and exhibitions at both sites have expanded, as have the exhibition spaces. Orlando moved from Encino to Sherman Oaks almost 25 years ago, increasing visibility, and establishing itself as a landmark venue on Ventura Boulevard. In the Fall of 2000, the CSUN Art

I, with my partner Philip Orlando, opened the Orlando art Gallery in 1958 in Encino on Ventura Boulevard. The gallery initially enticed its considerable 'drop-in' audience with a potpourri of art objects, including art deco works, ceramics and a wide range of primitive and African and tribal art.

Early in its history, Orlando Gallery became a launching pad for untested or radically experimental artists who have since gone on to develop in a more mainstream art world. Bob Gino and Philip Orlando reached out beyond the Valley location and established esthetic ties to the cutting edge of the larger Los Angeles art scene. In 1976 the gallery moved to a new location on Ventura Boulevard, in Sherman Oaks, where it remains today. Orlando Gallery is devoted to ongoing exhibitions of contemporary art, primarily by Los Angeles artists. It is the longest established contemporary art gallery in the Los Angeles area.

Since the demise of Philip Orlando in 1992, the Orlando Gallery has continued to flourish under the ownership of Bob Gino and Don Grant.


JEWEL IN THE ROUGH

Among the trendy shops and restaurants that line Ventura Boulevard in Sherman Oaks, there stands an oasis from all things mass produced and ordinary, filled with contemporary art, full of wonder and beauty, the Orlando Gallery would be unusual almost anywhere. In the San Fernando Valley. It is in a class by itself.

Since 1958, the gallery has been presenting an eclectic mix of and by California artists, most of them from Southern California, many of them from the Valley. Many are former California State University Northridge students. Phil Orlando (1923-1992) and Bob Gino were both dancers and owners of a dance studio in Encino when they opened their first art gallery in their dance studio. Not many art galleries are still in business after forty-one years. Not much of anything has that kind of longevity; in the Valley, not even the freeway. Orlando was in the Valley before there was a Ventura Freeway.

The Orlando Dance Studio had walls and Orlando and Gino had artist friends who thought those walls would look better with

their artwork on them instead of



the typical photographs of celebrities who had taken dance lessons. So they hung some paintings without any intention of selling them. "It looked nice," Gino says simply, innocently. "Our office faced Ventura Boulevard, and people driving by saw the art and stopped and inquired about it." Not long after they'd hung their first set of paintings, an openhanded man from Texas dropped in and decided to buy a whole wall full of art. Orlando and Gino found themselves in the art business.

By 1962 they had moved to a new Encino location. The front of the building was devoted to art. In the back, a room was available for dance lessons. They were new in the art world and they were looking to showcase new talent. They researched the world of art and took field trips to university campuses around Southern California to view artwork by graduate students. They became artists themselves, both working in the media of painting, sculpture, mixed media, and constructions. To the consternation of some critics, they exhibited Orlando's paintings, assemblages, collages and book art along with the artists they represented. To maintain the gallery, they gave private dance lessons.


In 1976, after their rent had tripled, they moved to their present location in Sherman Oaks. By then they had also become known for their African art collection, which today occupies one of three exhibition spaces in the gallery. Some of the sculptures are by self-taught artists are over 150 years old. When they first began to collect and show African art in the 1960s it was not the curiosity it has become in recent years. They couldn't give it away.

Emerson Woelffer, Eleanor Antin, Betye Saar and Robert Heinecken are among many local artists who were featured in Orlando Gallery exhibitions at the beginning of their careers. Photographer Judy Fiskin showed small photographs in the gallery in the 1970s. Rachel Rosenthal

gave her first performance there. Perhaps most notably, since they opened their doors, Orlando and Gino have shown as many women artists as men. "When we started out it was not easy to sell art by a woman who was not well known," Gino told the Los Angeles Times in 1992. "Many of the women who came to us used just their initials or even a take name to make it look like the artist was a man. We bled to gel them to use their real names."

Painters Lew Ott and Don Lagerberg, sculptor Edie Ellis Brown and installation artist Caroline Kent were among the first artists the gallery presented. Today, Bob Gino and Don Grant (Orlando's nephew) continue to show these artists' work. Each of them is represented in this California State University, Northridge exhibition featuring, twenty-six artists (including Phil Orlando) who work in every medium from painting, drawing, watercolor and sculpture to mixed media constructions, installations, collage, ceramics and photography. The Orlando Gallery was among the first galleries to show photography as art and the then new medium of concept video.

"I don't believe in any one school of art," Gino says. "And I think



everything is contemporary if it is being said well. All art is the ultimate of art if it's done well. It's the individual making the statement that puts that mark on how good it is.

However, artists and art galleries do not exist in a world of their own. Whenever anything significant occurs globally or locally, it has an effect on artists and galleries. The Orlando Gallery has weathered the many shockwaves that span the breadth of its

existence, including President John F. Kennedy's assassination, the depressed economy of the late-1980s, and the devastation of the 1994 Northridge earthquake, which left Ventura Boulevard in Sherman Oaks in shambles, art collectors throughout the Valley, to re-evaluate the worth and meaning of their art collections.

The earth has moved more than once since Orlando first opened its doors. The San Fernando Valley today bears little resemblance to the valley in which Sally Field took dance lessons as a child and Orlando and Gino first hung those paintings on the wall. But some things have not changed.

"There has been a great amount of growth and development in business and homes, but not so with art," Gino says. "Art exists all around us in various ways. Nature is the greatest form of art around us, but when you put it on canvas, people say they don't understand it."


What Gino finds difficult to understand is that after four decades of exhibiting art by California artists he still sees those artists go through a struggle to get the recognition they deserve from the local art community. "We underplay our own artists here. We're more concerned with New York art and ignore our own talent," Gino says. "The museums haven't accepted our artists. Phil and I encouraged the California scene. We gave exposure to California art, gave California artists opportunity."

The Orlando Gallery cycles on into a new millennium, doing what it has always done in the San Fernando Valley, with little competition or the camaraderie of peers. We can all join the CSUN Art Galleries in celebration this jewel in the rough for its creativity, it's openness and it's staying power.
